The standing chairman, BJ Carter, brought the meeting to order at 6:30 pm and presented the agenda for the evening:

A reading of the minutes from the previous meeting: BJ Carter

- There was one amendment regarding the financial report, to correct the amount in the bank.

Meeting Guidelines: BJ Carter

- BJ suggested that business meetings begin with a reading of guideline in order to avoid confusion, interruption, and misunderstandings during each business meeting.
  - Collaborative intentions
  - Positive participation
  - Active listening
  - No side conversations during the meeting
  - Supportive atmosphere

Financial report: Lois Chattin

- Checking -- \$2153.25; Savings – 1614.22
- Venmo, an app for the cell phone or computer, has been set up to pay dues online. Download the app, find the name of Lois Chattin and send payment. The service costs, \$0.25 for each transaction so

it was suggested that those wishing to pay through Venmo pay \$10.25. All agreed that this would be reasonable and prudent.

- Lois is still exploring the possibility of using Zelle through our bank, to create a place on our website to pay dues.

#### Old Business:

- Possibility of conducting a Flying Companion Seminar in Idaho Falls: Cindy Fritz is looking into this and will report at a future meeting.

#### New Business:

- “Let’s Fly Initiative” for the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Ninety-Nines International Organization of Women Pilots. The group was made award of this but no decisions were made at this time.
- Bylaws – there is a need to review the bylaws for our chapter. Sherry Kandle volunteered to look at them and make suggestions for any changes.
- Girl Scout Troupe request: a local girl scout troupe made a request to have a couple of women pilots come and talk to their group about aviation. Cheryl McCord and Stacey Budell volunteered to make contact to find out the dates of their meetings before we commit to filling their request.
- Fall Flying – An October Fly-In was suggested to Jerome for the Fall Festival and Farmer’s Market. Cheryl McCord volunteered to find out the exact Saturday in October.
- Scholarship Chair vacancy: Ashley Taylor has shown interest in becoming our new Scholarship Chair with the help of Alana Erikson and Wendy Frazer.
- Air Race Classic 2020 Start – an explanation was made to the reasons why our chapter turned down the opportunity to host the 2020 ARC Start --- basically it was too short of notice.

- Air Race Classic 2021 Terminus
  - Discussion on whether or not to host the 2021 Terminus of the ARC. Pros and cons were discussed.
  - Stacey Budell volunteered to become Chair and contact person for heading up the ARC Terminus with the help of MaryAnn Richards and Patty Mitchell.
  - A call was made to Minnetta to have the financial obligations clarified
  - Lois Chattin moved to have the chapter go forward in plans to host the ARC terminus in 2021 pending more information gained when we received the contract
  - The vote was unanimous to go ahead with plans to host the terminus pending agreement with the contract.
  
- Meeting was adjourned at 8:00

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We asked Stacy by October 1 to bring us up to speed on what's been going on with the terminus group. We asked for a written plan of action as best we can at such an early stage. The board will review it and then have a vote before the week is out. The main part of the meeting was we need to make sure communication is going both directions.

We also decided that the board will have a business meeting once a month. And then the general meeting would be announced for the members more social than business. Any member is welcome to attend the monthly board business meeting, however. We will try this way because we are such a social group that the board will take care of business and if necessary present to the members. Other than that our meetings will be more social than business.

We also discussed having the newsletter come out sometime during the second week of the month. And that a call for items to be included will be made by Susan Harper beforehand.

## **Award of Achievement (for Ninety-Nines)**

Three separate Awards of Achievement may be presented:

- \* for Contributions to The Ninety-Nines;
- \* for Contributions to Aviation;
- \* for Humanitarian Efforts.

An individual member of The Ninety Nines (living or deceased); a group of 99s; or an organization within The Ninety-Nines, such as a Chapter, Section, Committee, or Trust. An individual recipient must be a current member or have been a current member at the time of her death.

Recognizes a significant contribution to any facet of aviation, such as aviation or aerospace education, aviation science, aviation history, aviation commerce, aviation legislation, etc.

An individual (male or female, living or deceased) or an organization. The recipient may not be a current or former member of The Ninety-Nines or of a group within The Ninety-Nines.

## **Award of Merit (for non-Ninety-Nines)**

### **George Palmer Putnam Award (for non-Ninety-Nines)**

Recognizes support provided to The Ninety-Nines by an individual (male or female, living or deceased) or an organization. The contribution may have occurred in the past or present, as a single action or a series of events.

An individual (male or female, living or deceased), or an organization. The recipient may not be a current or former member of The Ninety-Nines or of a group within The Ninety-Nines

## Submissions of Nominations

1. Nominations for the Award of Achievement, Award of Merit, and the George Palmer Putnam Award may be submitted by any individual or group within The Ninety- Nines.
2. The nomination should be in the form of a one-page letter and up to three additional pages of substantiating material. The name, address and phone number of the nominee or the nominee's next of kin, if the nominee is deceased, should be included.
3. The nomination should be complete, but concise, details justifying the award to the nominee which such background information as considered pertinent, and any other relevant information, that would assist the Awards Committee.
4. Nominations from previous years may be resubmitted.
5. Nominations should be sent to the Ninety -Nines Headquarters to the attention of the Awards Committee.
6. Nominations may be submitted by electronic transmission ( fax or email) or by post. The nomination must be received on or before the nomination deadline.
